Agenda Item 2: Matters Arising from Previous Meeting, date 10 / 12 / 2018

ACC Lease: The lease for our club has been extended again for one year. ACC Lease has raised the lease price to \$542.00 per year.

Agenda Item 2: The Federal Sports Funding Grant application due December 2018 was not approved, but there is a second round in February 2019, which could still have a positive outcome.

Agenda Item 6: Darryl Young has made a new letterbox, which is in use now. The committee thanked Darryl for his efforts.

Agenda Item 8: Ian Radley is still researching the costs of a security camera. Item has been moved to the Action List.

Agenda Item 9: The pricing of the equipment stock still leaves room for discussion. Bas Smeulders will investigate the last year's equipment purchases and will provide a pricing proposal to the committee at the next meeting. A second proposal will be provided for an inventory list, which is not available today. Item has been moved to the Action List.

Agenda Item 10: The process to dispose of the fluorescent lights has once more been discussed. This has been a lesson identified and will be taken into account for future disposals.



General Business 1: The noisy whirly in the roof of the stadium has been fixed.

General Business 2: There is no set maximum of expenditures below \$500.00. Every expenditure below \$500.00 will be reported to the committee during the following meeting and noted in the minutes.

General Business 4: The fumigation, which happens every two years, has been put on hold, due to high priced quotes. Also, the problems are under control and at the moment it is not necessary to fumigate.

Darryl Young volunteers to fumigate the sports centre by himself, when necessary, using off-the-shelf pesticides, which are also used by the fumigation companies. Item has been moved to the Action List.

Agenda Item 6: Promotional Grant Ideas

Move It AUS – Participation Grant Program, Australian Government – Australian Sports Commission. AWTTA is invited to submit a proposal. AWTTA is opting for the Stream 1 Grant, which is funding local sport and physical activity organisations. The committee thanks Stuart Davidson for providing his ideas and together with Ian, Barbara, Ivan and Kerry being part of the group who will meet on 29 January 2019 to write a submission proposal. This submission proposal will be distributed to the rest of the committee members before submitting it. The application has to be submitted before 18 February 2019, 5:00pm AEST. The following ideas were discussed during the meeting

- Banner Pennants showing season overview;
- Commercials on tv and radio;
- School tours;
- Provide awareness to other sport associations that Table Tennis is a good alternative during the off-season, e.g. Netball association, etc...;
- Corporate table tennis competition;
- Partner with welfare agencies to provide the right opportunities for people that may have difficulties accessing sports due to their challenges/disabilities;
- Target people who may not participate in organised sport due to cost. Maybe subsidising their costs. Schools could possibly assist;
- Target newly arrived communities, which could feel constrained due to social structures and communication challenges. This would require some work regarding culture, translating, etc...;
- Partnership with specialist experts dealing with people with weight challenges. The right environment might help increase in sporting activity.

Agenda Item 7: Sausage Sizzle

The sausage sizzle at **Coles Wodonga** is booked for **18 May 2019** and is coordinated by Leonie O'Haire. The date for the sausage sizzle at Bunnings is not known yet.

Agenda Item 8: Space for Disability and Blind Night

The vision impaired and blind clients of Vision Australia will integrate with the Keenagers for a few weeks. This period will be used to understand if there are any issues and come up with solutions. The end goal is to nominate a night on which the vision impaired and blind people can play.

Agenda Item 10: Website

Mover: - **Seconder:** -

After a website update in October 2018, done by Interact Sport Pty Ltd, there was only trouble. The pennant coordinator, responsible for ensuring the information on the website is current and accurate, has submitted two tickets for the issues in October 2018. The issues have not been resolved yet and the pennant season starts at 11 February 2019. Ian Radley will investigate different options and will report back to the Committee.



After meeting note: Interact Sport has responded to the queries of David Smith and it has been advised that AWTTA should start looking for a new website host. The queries will not be resolved, but the website access will be extended for at least 12 months at no cost, to be able to recover any data, which could be used for another website. Item has been moved to the Action List.

Agenda Item 11: Unity

There is some friction between the Keenagers and Pennant Players, which should be dealt with as soon as possible. This could be achieved by organising internal events/tournaments with participation of both groups. Ideas are more than welcome.

Agenda Item 12: Club Events

It would be very much appreciated to increase the participation and Committee members and Pennant Coordinators are requested to promote the aforementioned tournaments. The advantages are to meet and play against other people, which will improve the social side and experience.

The committee will have 5 members of one group (including the President) and 4 members of the other group (including the Vice-President).

Unfortunately, the lighting has to be moved on at least one side of the hall, but maybe on both sides to reduce the shadows on the table as much as possible.

Kerry provided an estimate of \$400.00 for moving the lights.

The plan of attack is to await for further feedback from the Pennant Players regarding the shading on the table, but the but the tables have to be moved, so that the centre of the table is in the centre of the court.

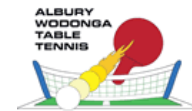
